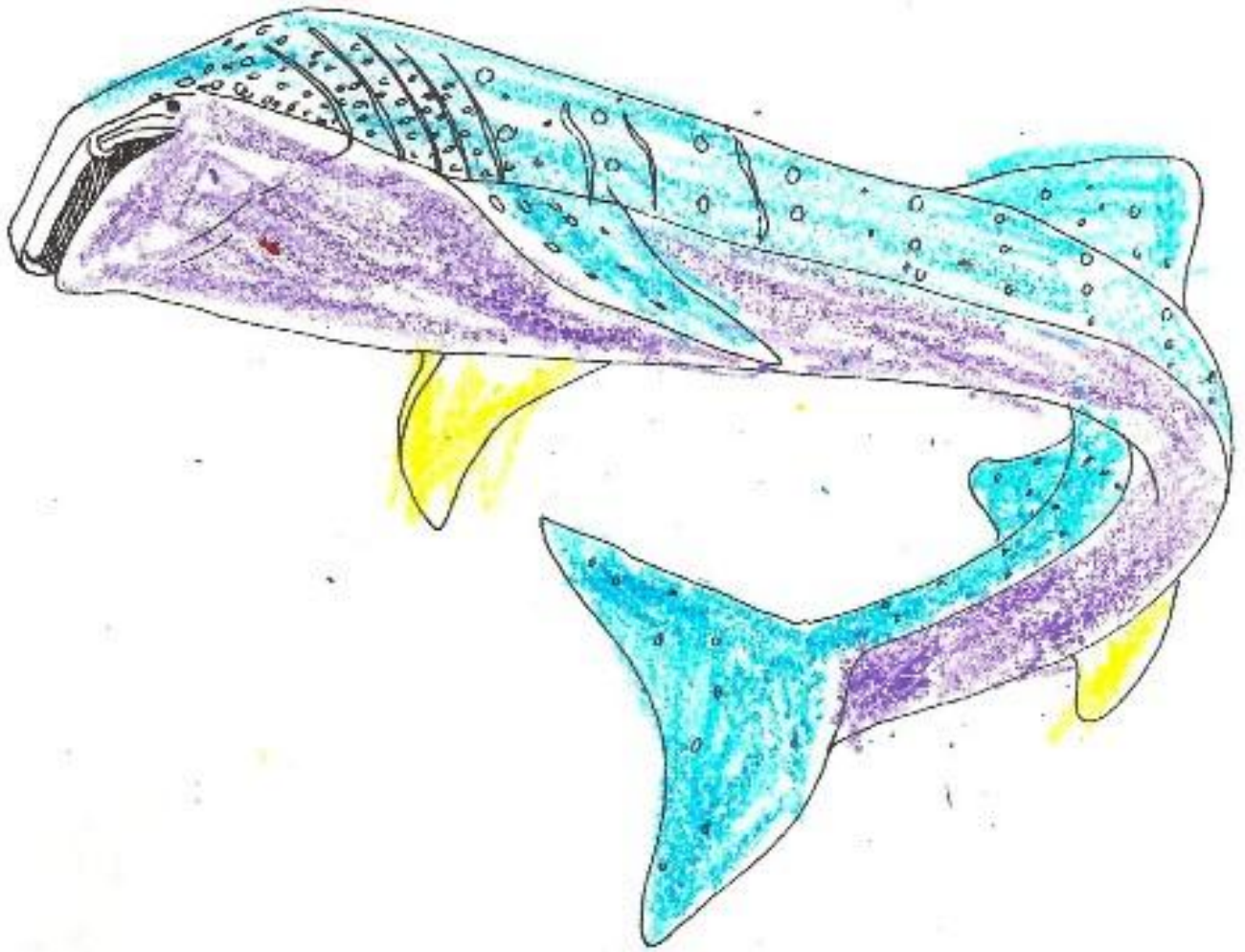
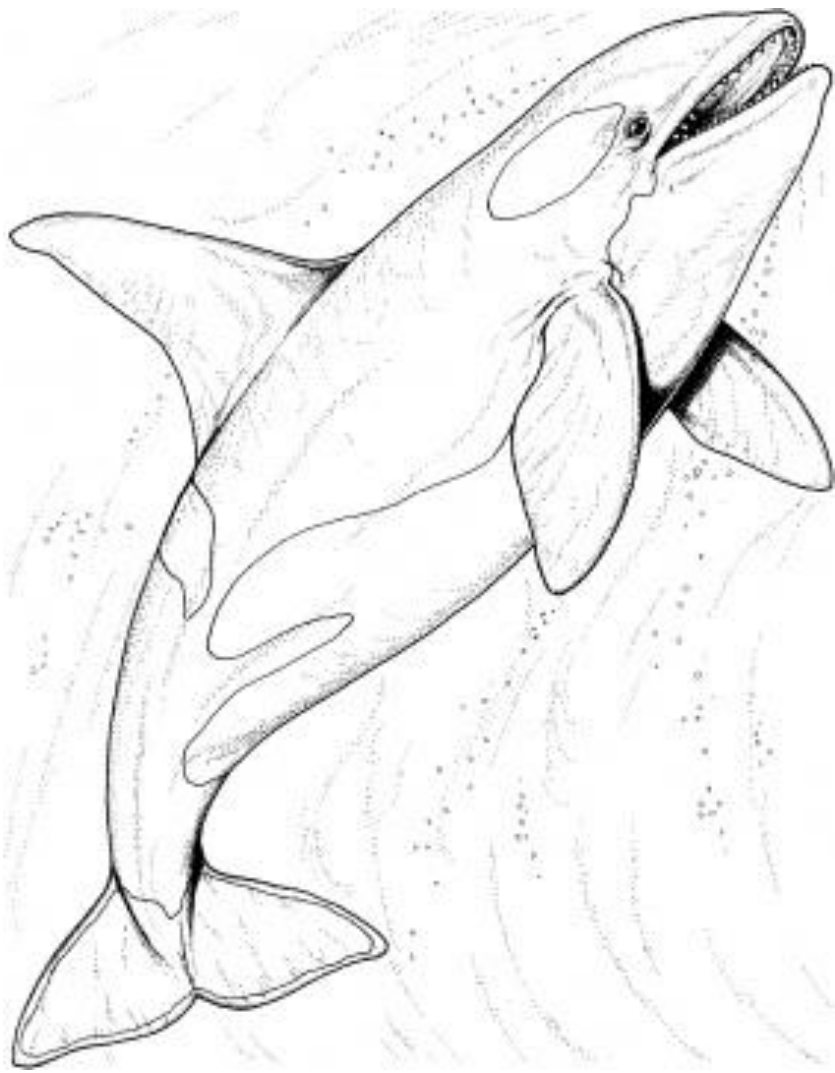

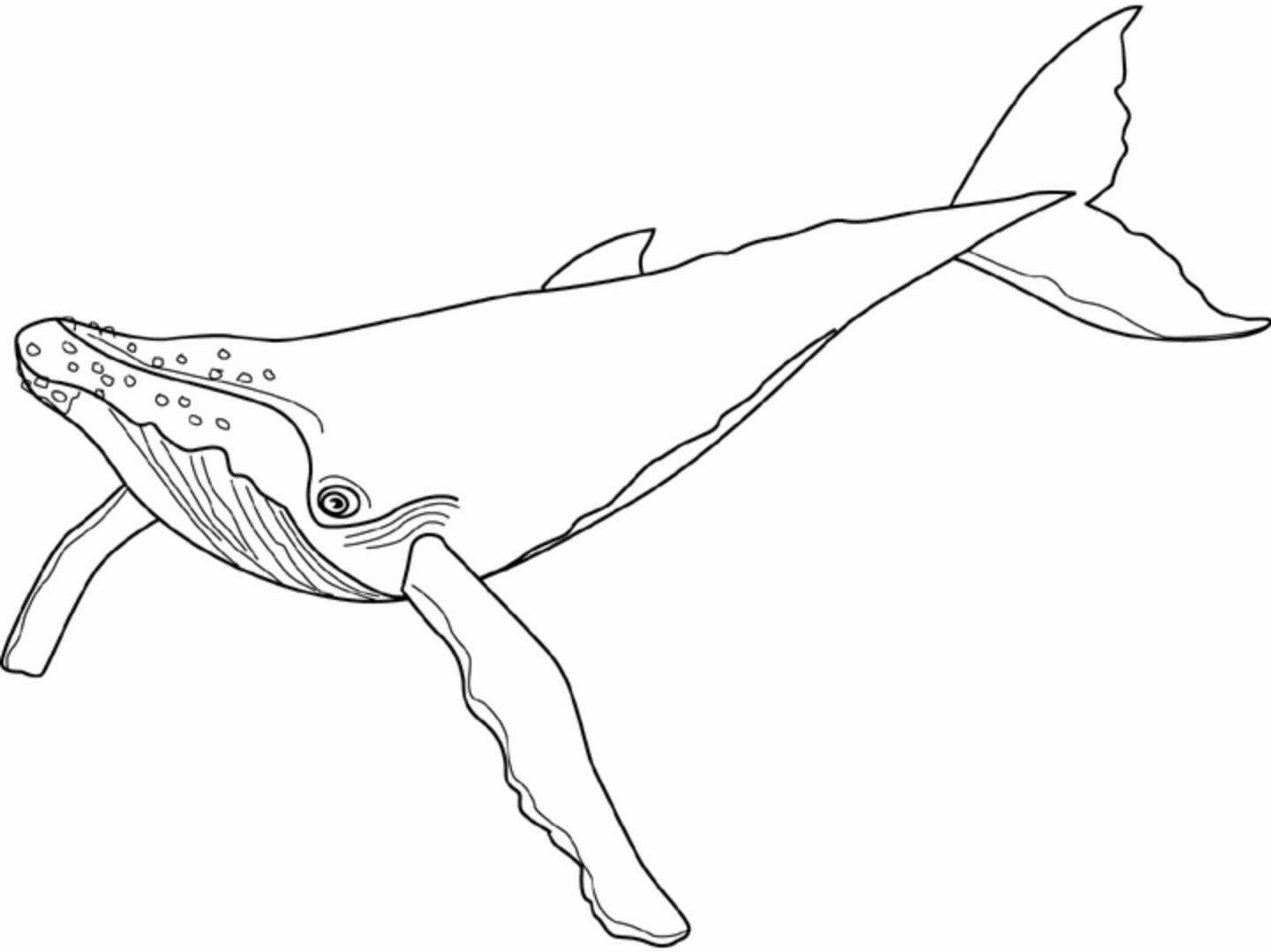
Whale shark

grazers eat plankton



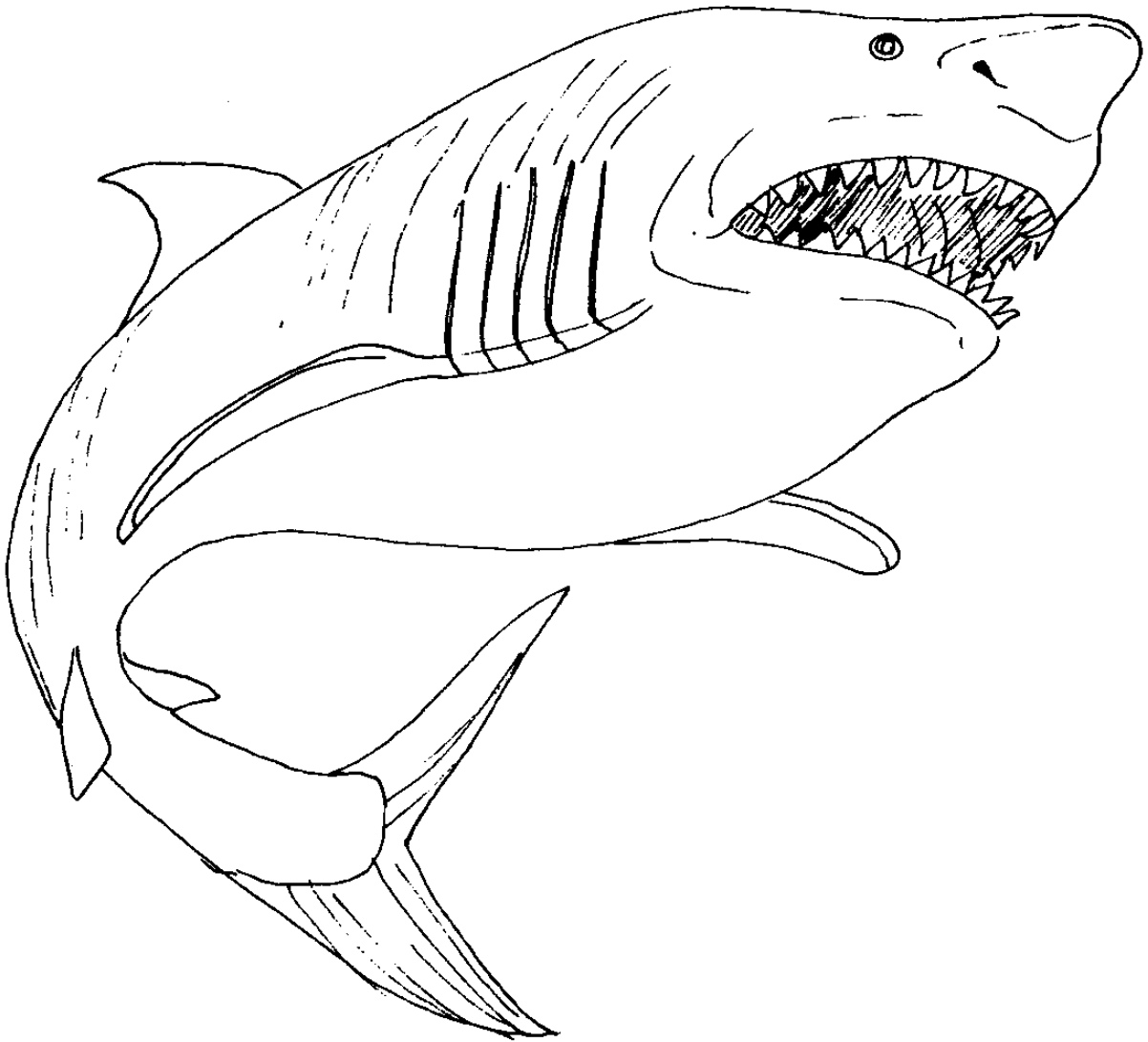
Killer Whale

- hunters eat seals & fish



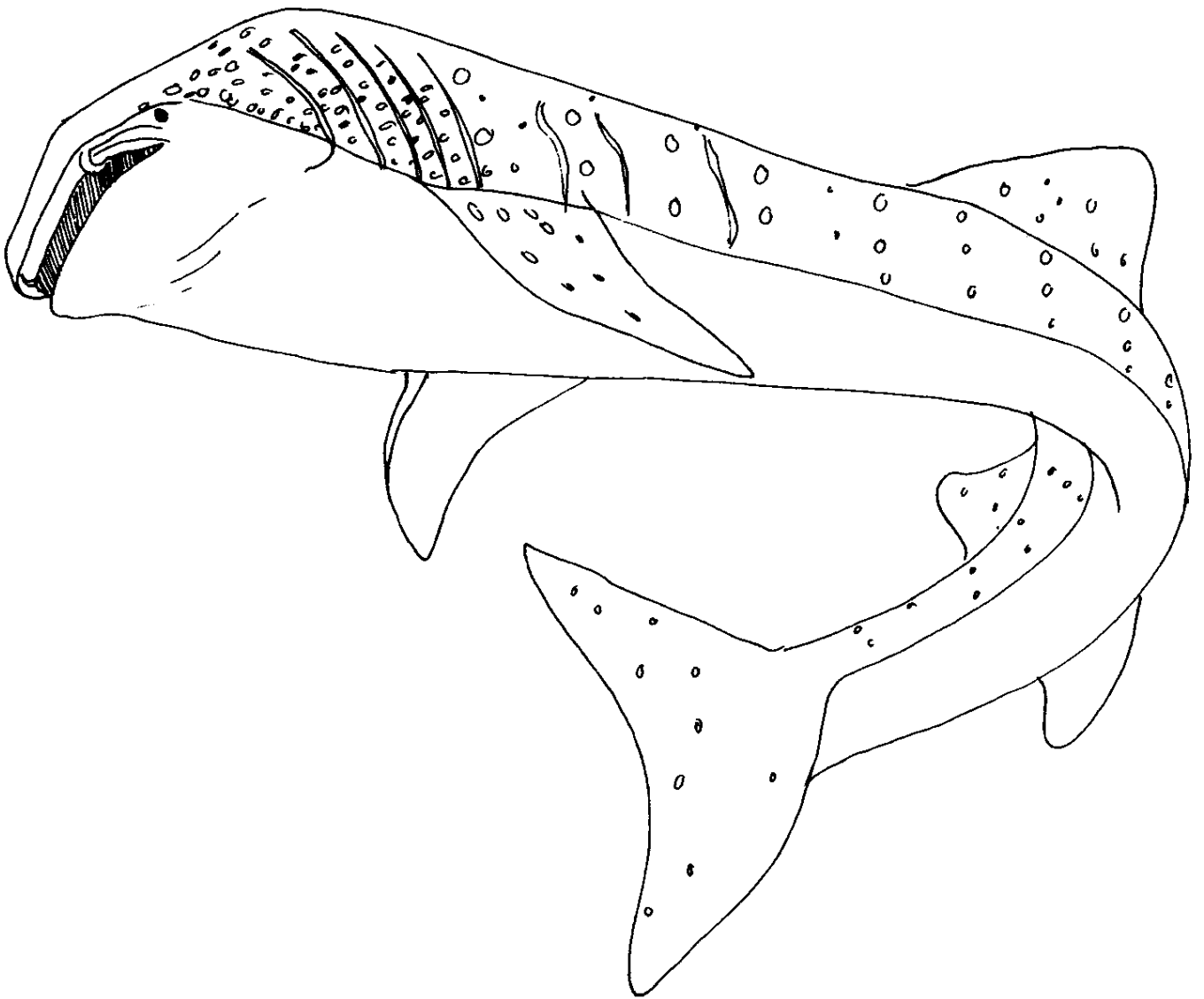
Humpback Whale
